Lo and behold there are hundreds of videos of him in performances by himself, with his group and or with other great people such as Pete Seeger and so on. Arlo loves to get his message out to the world through his songs and on many occasions during his songs. So I first chose Alice's Restaurant performed sometime in the past few years. That same smile was once again plastered all over my face. Some 18 minutes later I was selecting another.
