A meeting of 2 great minds!







The group David was speaking to was small but significantly larger than the gathering we had thrown




together for him in Brantford where we live.

He is quite animated explaining things. This makes him entertaining to watch as well as listen too.





Photo12. While listening to a question from the group David gives his undivided attention.
